Introduction to Kaleidoscope

Kaleidoscope is envisioned as an umbrella of learning programs that shall use the rich and dynamic lens of the different Social Sciences to deepen audiences' understanding of the world around them.

Just as a kaleidoscope reveals vibrant patterns through shifting angles, this umbrella program of Edwise will help audiences examine and critically reflect on different phenomena from an interdisciplinary perspective.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This program has been especially designed for Educational Leaders and Educators. Understanding the social, historic, economic and digital dynamics of the contexts in which educational institutions are embedded will enable members of the educational fraternity to deliver educational programs better suited for their young learners.

The course participants will be provided a structured exposure to the fundamental topics from within the Social Sciences, primarily from Political, Economic and Social Theory. Importantly, linkages between those concepts to education would be made explicit - thereby, helping current/prospective educators situate the educational enterprise amidst the broader socio-historical landscape.

Participants will also be encouraged to voice alternative perspectives on the subjective elements and normative assumptions underpinning our educational systems. Decolonial and leftist perspectives, indigenous voices and dissenting notes on digital technologies will be an important dimension of this program.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

It is expected that by the end of this course participants would be able to:

1. Apply an interdisciplinary lens to analyze complex issues within educational contexts.

3. Analyze the reciprocal relationship between educational systems and dominant social and political structures.
4. Critically assess the curriculum, pedagogical approaches, and organizational structures of schools.
